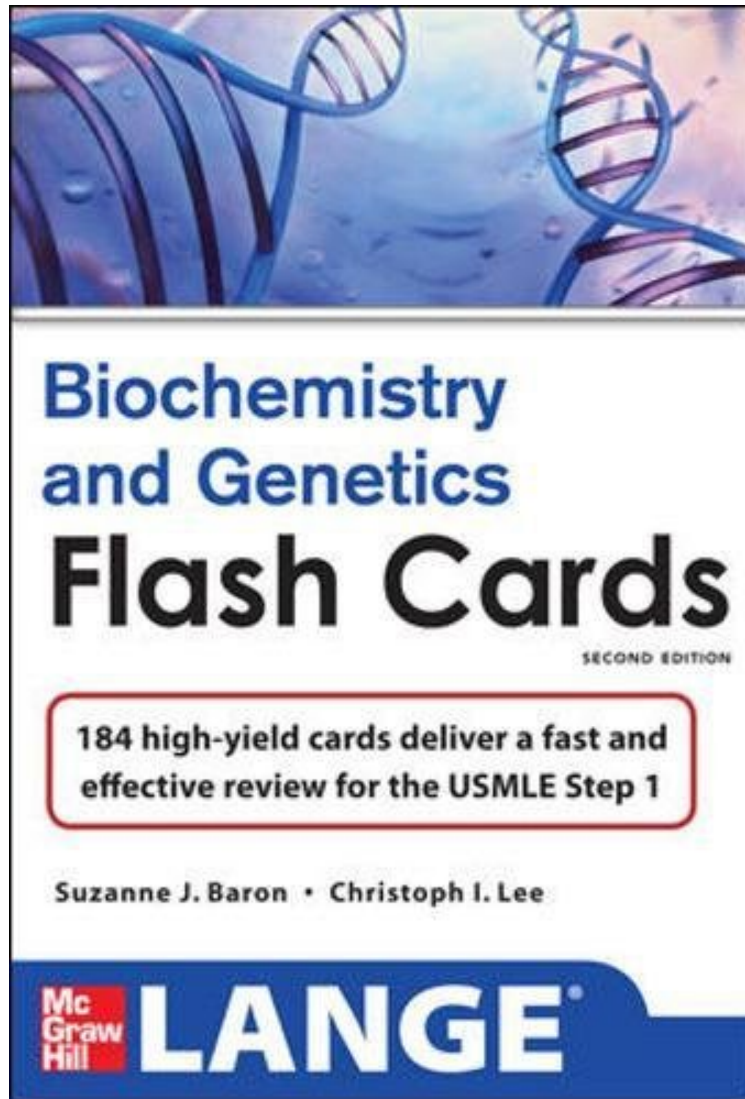

5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. Errors, but still helpful By Ryan Fitt It's frustrating to see so many errors on these. For example, arrows pointing the wrong way (card 58), and nucleoside chemical structures completely

wrong (card 70). My other complaint is that there aren't nearly as many chemical structures as I'd like. I understand it's not practical to show all the structures, and a lot of people may not want to see them, but it's really helpful for me to be able to connect a name with a structure. In spite of their flaws, I still find these helpful. 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Many mistakes. Use First Aid By Samuel H. These cards are not that helpful for USMLE step 1. Numerous errors, with some of them that could be quite detrimental. They also use inconsistent naming of enzymes which does not help when comparing various deficiencies. I wish I had just read through First Aid's biochem section prior to buying these and then using internet sources to clarify anything as needed. The only reason I give it 2 stars instead of 1 is because the clinical scenario flash cards are actually a good way to quiz yourself once you have learned the material. 9 of 9 people found the following review helpful. Kindle Edition By Paul. The information provided on the Flash Cards was high-yield for the most part. However, on the Kindle edition, the explanation side should have a better design. It is in picture form and the letters are REALLY small, thus difficult to read.
